About the Performance

Part costume drama, part queer love story, part tragicomedy: 'Crypthand' is inspired by the 19th century coded diaries of Anne Lister. Written by Lily Falk and directed by Laura Vingoe-Cram, this award winning script follows two young girls at boarding school, one raised in south India, the other in England who find freedom and belonging with each other while the wider world closes in. Three actors take on this vibrant and dense universe playing schoolgirls, religious sisters, characters from Greek mythology, and town councillors. The play is underscored with string arrangements by GaRRy Williams and performed by Alexa Kirste.

The show runs 90 minutes without an intermission.

How to Get to the Bus Stop Theatre

The Bus Stop Theatre's address is 2203 Gottingen St., Halifax, Nova Scotia.

By Bus:

You can get to the Bus Stop Theatre via bus routes 1, 7B, 10, 41. The stop name is Gottingen St. Before Cunard.


By Foot:

You can enter the Bus Stop Theatre on Gottingen street. It has a big, rusty coloured metal sign above the theatre.

The Bus Stop entrance is level with the sidewalk. There are automatic power doors with the button on the right hand side. There's a ramp inside the door in the lobby.

When you come inside there will be a table with the Front of House volunteer who will check your name off our audience list.

The Front Entrance looks like this:

Parking

Street parking can be challenging on Gottingen St. There is one 15-minute accessible parking spot directly in front of the theatre.

Bathrooms

There are three all-gender bathrooms in the lobby, the one closest to the theatre is wheelchair accessible. The accessible bathroom door opens with a power bar towards the lobby. When the bathroom is in use, a light turns on above it.

Cryptphand contains moments of racism, homophobia, moments of sexuality, intense emotions, and strong language.

The piece is recommended for ages 13+.

Seating

The seating for theatre is armless metal chairs that look like this:

They are set in rows of wooden risers. There are 70 seats in the theatre.

The first row of seats is on stage level and is easily removable. If you would like seating removed in advance of arriving for your wheelchair or mobility device, please email Lily at galeforcetheatre@gmail.com

All seats are general admission so your ticket doesn't tell you where to sit.

Lobby

The lobby includes a bar which has a higher and lower end. You can remove your mask for drinking but we ask you keep it up between sips! The bar will open one hour before the show.

In the lobby, there will be paper flower decorations hanging from the ceilings

The house will open 15 minutes before the performance and the doors will be propped open.

Should you need to leave at any point, an usher will be available to escort you out.

Sensory Notes

The show contains lights, live and pre recorded sound, and projection.

Projection:

The set is made of fabric flats that are used as projection surfaces. There are occasional flickering projections and one moment of flashing projection. There's one fast shift out of a light coloured projection.

Live Sound:

There's live sound played on the violin with the musician on stage. They play throughout.

Prerecorded Sound:

There's some fairly loud and occasionally sudden pre-recorded sounds throughout the show. Things include sounds like a bells ringing, stones moving, and chimes.

Light:

There are abrupt lights up. There are no flashing lights.

Audience Size

There are a maximum of 70 audience members per night in the space.

COVID-19 Protocol

Masks are required to attend this performance. Masks are available in the theatre lobby or you could ask an usher for one.

Audio Description

There will be live audio description by Kat Germain offered at the October 2, 2pm performance. Users will be given a small receiver with a single earpiece to hear the description.

If you wish to hear our audio description introduction that will give context to the piece with descriptions of projection, lighting, and set, it will be given at 1:30pm on the day of the show.
